

Biography:

A/Prof Raymond Chua graduated from the Faculty of Medicine in the National University of Singapore in 1997 and is a registered public health specialist and a fellow of the Academy of Medicine since 2007. He is currently the Deputy Director-General of Health for Healthcare Regulation in the Ministry of Health and concurrently appointed as the Assistant Commissioner for Cybersecurity by the Cybersecurity Agency of Singapore.

He also oversees the end-to-end regulations for healthcare services and information, from policy to inspection and audit to enforcement, as well as the cybersecurity policies for the critical information infrastructure in the healthcare ecosystem. Prior to this, he was the Group Director of the Health Products Regulation Group in the Health Sciences Authority from 2012 to 2016 as well as the Managing Director and Regional Medical Directors of 2 global pharmaceutical companies, Eisai and Shire, providing oversight to increase the initiation of global clinical trials in the Asia-Pacific region.

He is currently a member of multiple regulatory committees under the Public Service Division to steer and guide regulatory practices in public service.

Dr William Lim completed his Basic degree in Dental Surgery in 2008 with the Outstanding Undergraduate Research Prize.

He subsequently went on to pursue his Masters in Oral & Maxillofacial Surgery in the year 2010.

Dr William Lim served as a Consultant in the National Dental Centre Singapore where he was the Head of the Oral and Craniofacial Implant Program.

Dr William Lim became a Fellow of the Academic Medicine Institute in 2016. He served as the President of the Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons Singapore in 2021 and believes in giving back to the profession.

Dr. Sha Yang obtained her Bachelor in Dental Surgery from National University of Singapore (NUS) in 2013. After graduation, she served in various public health institutions for 4 years, during which she developed a strong interest in Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery.
