

Vital Pulp Therapy - The Way Forward?

Synopsis:

The 2021 AAE position statement on vital pulp therapy marked a significant milestone, and from January 2022, vital pulp therapy became a major focus of Dr Koh's clinical practice. The evolution of HCSCs (hydraulic calcium silicate cement) has been central to improving clinical outcomes, and Dr Koh's extensive experience informs his approach to case selection, treatment protocols, and prognostic assessment. The paradigm shift in vital pulp therapy has expanded its indications to include cases with symptomatic irreversible pulpitis.

In this presentation, Dr Koh shares his clinical knowledge, research insights, and case series on vital pulp therapy. He will also share his thoughts on how vital pulp therapy may change the way we manage symptomatic and asymptomatic deep caries.

Dr Koh Eng Tiong graduated from the National University of Singapore in 1984. He completed

his Master of Science in Endodontics with Distinction in 1995 at Guy's Hospital, University of London. Under the mentorship of the late Prof Tom Pitt Ford, his research and numerous publications—co-authored with Prof Pitt Ford and Prof Mahmoud Torabinejad—focused on Mineral Trioxide Aggregate (MTA). His research supervisor was Prof Fraser McDonald, former Dean of the Faculty of Dental Surgery, Royal College of Surgeons of Edinburgh.

Upon returning to Singapore, Dr Koh practised as an endodontist at the National Dental Centre and lectured part-time at the National University of Singapore. In 1999, he was awarded Fellowship of the Academy of Medicine, Singapore. Prior to joining Raffles Dental as Senior Consultant and Specialist in Endodontics, Dr Koh successfully managed his own private practice for 19 years.
